Business Meeting Agenda: August, 8th 2021: 11:00-11:30 EST

I. CALL TO ORDER: Jennifer Karas Montez

Provided a description of the plan for the meeting and noting only 30 minutes.

II. APPROVAL OF 2020 MINUTES: Jennifer Karas Montez

Motion to approve the minutes by Jacqui Angel, Toni Calasanti seconded. Minutes were approved by the members.

III. TREASURER'S REPORT: Dawn Carr

Dawn noted that the current overall account balance is just above \$31,000, and there have been slight decreases in allocation and minimal fundraising relative to previous years. With the online conference (and no mentoring dinner), overall costs are down despite decreases in income.

IV. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Two presentation sections today, 6 roundtables, the MWR lecture after this. All very exciting. We had intended to have one session to be a flash talk and that was reconfigured to a regular presentation and will be asking for feedback on flash talk versus traditional sessions.

Stacy is not available to attend. Jennifer noted that the announcements go out every two weeks. The listserv is very helpful for members to stay on top of things. She requested that we make sure that if you want to promote a new publication to do that on the social media locations, not the listserv.

E. Research Groups and Roundtables Committee:

Bridget noted that there were 31 participants and submissions and organized into six sections, and no research roundtable submissions. Stephanie noted that there were several volunteers who served as facilitators that were key to the success of the roundtables.

F. Committee on Nominations:

Toni Calasanti

Toni thanked the nomination committee with the nominees and the new section council members.

G. Announcements/reports for 2021 Awards

Susan Short chaired the committee for Outstanding Publication Award. She presented the award to Courtney Boen for her paper recently published at The Journal of Health and Social Behavior: "Criminal justice contacts and psychophysiological functioning in early adulthood: Health inequality in the carceral state.

The graduate student paper award committee was chaired by I-Fen Lin, and the award was presented by Marc Garcia. The award was given for a working paper written by Leafia Zi Ye, titled "Continuous integration or cumulative (dis)advantage? U.S. Immigrants' economic trajectories in later life."

An honorable mention was also acknowledged for Tabitha Wilber's recently published manuscript at *Social Forces*: "Stressed but not depressed: A longitudinal analysis of first-generation college students, stress, and depressive symptoms."

The Matilda White Riley award was not provided this year due to the pandemic to get us back on track. We will be resuming this award next year. Today the MWR lecture will be provided by Merril Silverstein who was given the award in 2019.

The outstanding mentor award committee was chaired by Jacqueline Angel. Jacqui presented the award to Linda George.

V. New Business

SALC council voted to extend our mentorship activities in two ways. First, SALC will offset the costs of the mentoring dinner for a certain number (approximately 10, depending on the budget) of BIPOC students and postdocs, with at least half of those costs covering the dinner for existing SALC members. The section will offer this for three years and then assess the budget sustainability and whether members find it helpful and want to continue. Another activity will create pairs of SALC members, where a junior BIPOC member can be paired with a more senior member during a year, starting after the ASA meeting and culminating at the ASA mentoring dinner. The pairs would be asked to talk approximately three times during the year. The details will be worked out in the coming months. Again, the section aims to offer this for three years and then assess how well it is working, and decide whether to continue.

VI. Change of council member hands

All outgoing members were identified and thanked for their contributions over the years. Merril was introduced as incoming chair for the next year. Merril noted goals for the upcoming year. Next year's program will tentatively contain sessions on "Caregiving Careers in an Era of Family and Social Change" and "Cross-National Differences in Life Course Dynamics and Aging". Jacqui Angel and Jennifer Ailshire will organize the sessions.
